1st XI played seven matches in all - beating Charterhouse and Harrow from the UK very convincingly before Xmas and then, in the Peninsula Festival here in Cape Town last week, they beat St Davids, Waterkloof and Pretoria Boys High School but lost to Jeppe and then to Waterkloof in a T20 match. Overall: played 7, won 5 and lost 2.

The 2nd XI played in the Table Mountain Festival hosted by Bellville HS and played five T20s – winning 4 and losing in the semi-final. They also played two 50 over matches beating Curro School and then losing to s strong Grey College team. Overall: played 7, won 5 and lost 2.

The Under 15As had an excellent early season success over WBHS, also defeated Waterkloof and then the Hampshire Colts XI in a T20 match. Overall: played 4, won 3 and lost 1.

Boat Race 2019

On Friday 6 December 2019 the first 8 and spare, departed for the Boat Race in Port Alfred in the Eastern Cape. This race is held on the Kowie River and consists of multiple bends throughout its length of 5,3km. The race itself is a take on the Oxford Cambridge Boat Race with a twist. The South African version involves around 18 schools in total and as such there is a time trial followed by finals the following day. The trial, or heats, requires every boat to race down the course in 30 second intervals. The order is based on the previous year's results. Each boat then achieves a "heats time", this is then used to separate the crews into various finals the following day. So, the fastest two times make the A final, 3rd and 4th fastest times into the B final, and so on.

Due to the river consisting of various bends, tidal flow, wind as well as saltwater it requires plenty of adaption for both athletes and the Coxswain (driver). As such we decided to acclimatize by arriving a week prior to the heats, a decision that benefited the 8 immensely.

The heats took place on Friday. Bishops had a decent race but were unfortunately not fast enough and were placed into the E final against Rondebosch. An idea of the competition can be illustrated by the fact that our 10th spot finish in the heats was 26 seconds off 2nd spot position, 2 seconds off the placing above and 14 seconds off the placing above that. This all being over 5km.

The finals, which are held the following day, are far more tactical due to the nature of the course and its bends. Bishops had a great start, however Rondebosch, with the help of some current, were able to nudge ahead for the corner and thus nullify the possible advantage of the Bishops' bank. From here the Bishops crew did well to fight the entire course but unfortunately the damage had been done and Rondebosch went on to win the E final.

Congratulations to the crew. Although it was far from the result that was hoped for or expected they managed to keep their heads up and represent Bishops in an excellent fashion.
