Buffalo Regatta

Buffalo regatta is a 2km race held along the Buffalo River in East London. It is considered to be one of the oldest sports events to be held in South Africa, even older than the Currie Cup. The Thursday sees athletes race their various heats and if they progress, they then race their finals on the Saturday. What makes it an even more interesting event is that between those two days another regatta is held. This is the Selborne sprints regatta along the same river but over a much shorter distance, 500m. This format is fast and furious and requires a different type of race strategy. Often crews are split by a photo finish and mere split seconds. For example, the first 8's event which is deemed as the blue-ribbon event of the day, saw 2nd, 3rd and 4th place split by 0,3 seconds.
